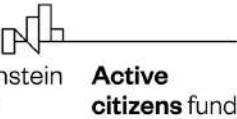

The project “Archimedes – Tool for Measuring Social Impact” aims to develop a holistic tool for assessing the social impact of projects, actions and investments, with a view to highlighting the importance of the positive social impact of any initiative.

This digital tool, based on the SROI (Social Return on Investment) methodology and a broad database, will contribute to a holistic approach to value - from an economic, environmental and social perspective - and to reliable and meaningful information on the effectiveness of various actions.

The project is implemented by KMOP – Social Action and Innovation Centre (www.kmop.gr).

The ultimate purpose of the project is to change the way social value is measured and to enhance the contribution of different organisations to society.
